

Camp Chaplain

Responsible to Camp Director

Qualifications:

- 18 to 99 years old
- Must have a proven ability and desire to lead, learn, and give as a servant of Jesus Christ, to meet the needs of all campers and staff.
- Must have a written testimony of faith and trust in Jesus Christ alone for eternal life.

Responsibilities:

- Available for at least one camp session, but multiple sessions are desired
- Attend all staff prayer and devotion meetings lifting up yourself, the campers and fellow staff in prayer.
- Responsible to teach God's Word to the campers as a group Sunday through Thursday evenings around the campfire and Friday afternoons to present a "send off" challenge to the campers (Woodsman Camp teaching times will be 15-20 minutes; Ranger Challenge teaching times will be 30 minutes).
- As the teacher, the campers perceive the chaplain as non-authoritarian that is an approachable man who expresses thought provoking ideas or insights each evening and is available for campers to talk with throughout the day (meals, activities, between activities, etc.)
- To visit with campers as you lead an activity during the day and visit with campers during the meals
- Responsible for "hanging out" with the campers and staffers throughout the week with the goal being to get to know them and to assist the servant-leaders in helping them find out where each one is spiritually
- To counsel campers and staffers when issues arise upon Camp Director's request.
- A private air-conditioned room and all meals are provided. There will be a time set aside each day for personal study, prayer and rest.
